The U.S. District Court for the Northern District of California issued an <u>order</u> on May 6 requiring the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) to approve or disapprove submitted state plans and develop a federal plan under the <u>2016</u> <u>MSW Landfill Emission Guidelines</u> (EG). The judgement came as a result of a <u>lawsuit brought by eight states</u> that claimed EPA had a mandatory duty to review and approve or disapprove any state plans submitted and impose a federal plan for those that did not submit one.

EPA asserted that states did not have standing to bring this suit, but the court held that the states had standing. As a result, the court ordered EPA to approve or disapprove the five state plans already submitted within 4 months, no later than September 6, 2019, and to promulgate a federal plan within 6 months, no later than November 6, 2019. States that have not submitted yet can continue seeking approval of state plans even after the federal plan is in place. EPA will then have 4 months from submission of the state plan to approve or disapprove. EPA has not yet announced whether it will appeal the court's ruling.

SWANA and the Landfill Gas & Biogas Technical Division will continue to review this case and provide updates to the Core Advocacy Group as necessary. Please feel free to contact me at (240) 494-2237 or at <u>imaxwell@swana.org</u> with any questions.

# Subject: Request for National Garbage Man Day Stamp Approval

Dear Committee Members:

I am writing to you to urge the Citizens' Stamp Advisory Committee approve a stamp recognizing the extraordinary and enduring daily contributions that are made by solid waste collection workers to American society and the environment. This is in support of a similar request made by National Garbage Man Day volunteer Steve Goode on May 3, 2019.

As the Executive Director of the Solid Waste Association of North America (SWANA), an organization of more than 10,000 public and private sector professionals in the solid waste management field, I know how valuable these workers are to our communities. There are more than 200,000 solid waste collection workers in the United States and issuing a stamp to celebrate and show appreciation to those who collect our garbage and recycling would be an appropriate way to commemorate their significant positive impact.

These hard-working men and women go into our communities every day in all types of weather and collect nearly 260 million tons of garbage and recyclables per year, according to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency's most recent data. They make sure our country remains a clean and safe place to live and work. Not only is collecting garbage and recycling a difficult job, it is unfortunately very dangerous as well. Nationwide, solid waste and recycling collection employees work in the 5<sup>th</sup> deadliest occupation in the United States, according to the federal Bureau of Labor Statistics. That puts it ahead of police officers or fire fighters. Issuing a stamp will help to raise the profile of this important, and often overlooked segment of the U.S. workforce.

For these reasons, SWANA asks that the Citizen's Stamp Advisory Committee issue a stamp that commemorates the long history of solid waste collection workers protecting human health and the environment in the United States.
