Approve Minutes of April 3, 2014 - Mr. Hartman asked about additions or corrections to the minutes of the April 3, 2014 meeting. On motion by Mr. Raudenbush, seconded by Mr. Pedersen and unanimous vote, the minutes were approved as submitted.

Treasurer's Report – Mr. Taylor was not present at the meeting. Due to the timing of the May meeting no Treasurer's Report was available.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Legislative Committee – Mr. Hartman provided a written Legislative Update Chart for April 2014. It was noted that the majority of the report related to Marcellus Shale.

Membership/Market Strategy Committee Report – Mr. Hartman reported that the Young Professional Adhoc committee has completed work on the letter and flyer and he believes it is ready for the website. Also SWANA National has put out an article on their website. A discussion followed regarding the process of trying to get Young Professionals into SWANA.

Newsletter Committee - Mr. Hasemeier said that currently B&L are waiting for two articles for the next issue of *The Keystone* that will be published by the end of May.

Nominating Committee – Mr. Hartman said it is time to start soliciting the nominations for officers and directors for 2014-2016. **Mr. Wehler** is chair of the committee and **Mr. Pederson** and **Mr. Watts** are committee members. Ms. Dougherty provided an announcement that will be sent out to the membership on May 2nd.

Program/Training Committee Reports

<u>*Mini Technical Seminars*</u> – Mr. Wood was not present at the meeting. Mr. Hartman reported that the Mini Technical Seminar on HDPE Welding, hosted by Lee Supply at their Downingtown facility is scheduled for May 8^{th,} Ms. Dougherty said there were approximately 8 people signed up for the seminar to date.

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Ms. Dougherty reported that she received a final financial report from PROP on the Anaerobic Digestion Workshop and Tour of the Reinford Dairy Farm in Mifflintown that was held on April 24th. The seminar was jointly sponsored by PROP and SWANA.

<u>Fall Conference</u> – **Ms. Nestor** gave an update on the fall conference. Mary Webber, PWIA will be meeting with Steve Socash, PADEP to finalize the list of topics for the conference. Ms. Nestor and Ms. Webber will be meeting with the Hilton Hotel after this meeting to review the layout for the exhibitor hall. It is important to get the exhibitors as much recognition as possible. All breaks will be held in the exhibitor hall. The exhibitor and sponsor fees have been finalized. Terry Madonna will be the plenary speaker at Wednesday's luncheon.

Mr. Pederson reported that two weeks ago a conference call was held by the committee members. The discussions included: speakers, program, flow of activities, signage, and audio-visual and included input provided from a meeting Ms. Webber had with PADEP. Also adjustments have been made to sponsorship fees. There will be the advertising of sponsors throughout the entire conference. Another conference call is being set up for next week. The fall conference planning is going very well.

Scholarship Committee – Mr. Dougherty reported that four scholarship applications were received for Category I High School Seniors. Two applications were received for Category II students entering their junior or senior undergraduate year and pursing a degree in environmental science, engineering or other suitable major related to the solid waste management field. Also, one application has been received for the Robert P. Stearns/SCS Engineering Award Category which is for full-time students who are entering or are in graduate school pursing a degree in environmental science, engineering or other suitable major related to the field of solid waste management.

Chapter recommendations must be forwarded to the International Scholarship Committee for review by June 1st.

ROAD-E-O Committee - Mr. Watts was not present at the meeting. The 2014 Mid-Atlantic Regional ROAD-E-O Committee have invited SWANA members from Washington, DC, West Virginia, Virginia and New York to participate in the ROAD-E-O, along with the Pennsylvania, Delaware and New Jersey members. This year's event will again be held at the MES Midshore II Facility in Maryland on Friday, June 6, 2014.

On motion by **Mr. Hasemeier**, second by **Mr. Raudenbush** and unanimous vote, the Board approved the attendance of Ms. Dougherty at the ROAD-E-O.

International Director's Report – Mr. Watts was not present at the meeting but did provide the following written report.

- Financial challenges are ahead in FY 2015 for SWANA due to declining revenue and increasing expenses

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- WASTECON Long Beach had a loss of \$165,000, eLearning is \$31,000 below budget this year, Membership and Technical Division revenues are down, Senior Executive Seminar was \$51,000 below budget
- Policy T-11 Conversion Technologies as Part of Integrated Solid Waste Management revision was approved by the IB
- Policy MA-14 Other Elements of Chapter Good Standing Appendix A voted to approve
